Are you planning a change to the exterior of your house, such as a fence, room addition, landscaping, gazebo or a pool? Please be aware that the NPPOA covenants require these changes be reviewed and approved by the NPPOA Architectural Control Committee (ACC), **before** making the change.

Tree Corner (Contributor – Stephanie Perry)

1. What to do with our Ash Trees?

Over the past several decades, the Ash tree was planted heavily in landscaping. North Pointe has enjoyed mature Ash trees for years. Their full canopy and beautiful fall color have been a treat to enjoy. As a homeowner, you may be wondering if you should fight the Emerald Ash Borer beetle with chemicals, or cut your losses and have the tree removed. The following is some information that may help you make that decision. It's the adult Emerald Ash Borer beetle larva that does all the harm to the ash trees. Larvae tunnel under the bark and disrupt the tree's systems that transport food and water, eventually starving and killing the tree.

Bill Jones, owner of Jones Tree Surgery has for some advice for **preventative** treatment to healthy Ash trees. In his opinion, the Emerald Ash Borer has not damaged our neighborhood's trees like they may have in other parts of town. If your trees have not shown distress and the branches are showing buds, you don't need to lose your trees. Below is one option.

Recipe for one tree - to be apply the end of May AND in August
Large container of Bayer Emerald Ash Borer treatment
Mix 15-16 cups of the treatment with 4 gallons of water in a 5 gallon bucket
Thoroughly soak each tree from the base, extending out to the drip line
As an added tip to keep your trees healthy, thoroughly water your trees once a month using a simple tool for aerating the soil under trees. A water stake or aerating fork perforates the soil down to a measured depth. The tool is pressed into the soil to the desired depth. The holes created by this action allow water, air and fertilizer to reach the roots. With the compact, clay soil in McLean County - this is a great boost to the trees - particularly during our dry spells.

2. Did you know the City of Bloomington will trim trees on the city property between the sidewalk and street at no charge? You may have noticed the City has been removing some Ash trees on city property in North Pointe. Those trees were considered unhealthy. If you are an affected homeowner - the City has sent a letter informing you of the tree removal, along with instructions on how to have that tree replaced. If you haven't received a letter (or accidently threw it away), call the Parks and Recreation office at the City of Bloomington to request a replacement. We are fortunate the city will remove and replace new trees. Remember to do your part to keep the tree healthy with water and fertilization - particularly during those first 3-5 years.
